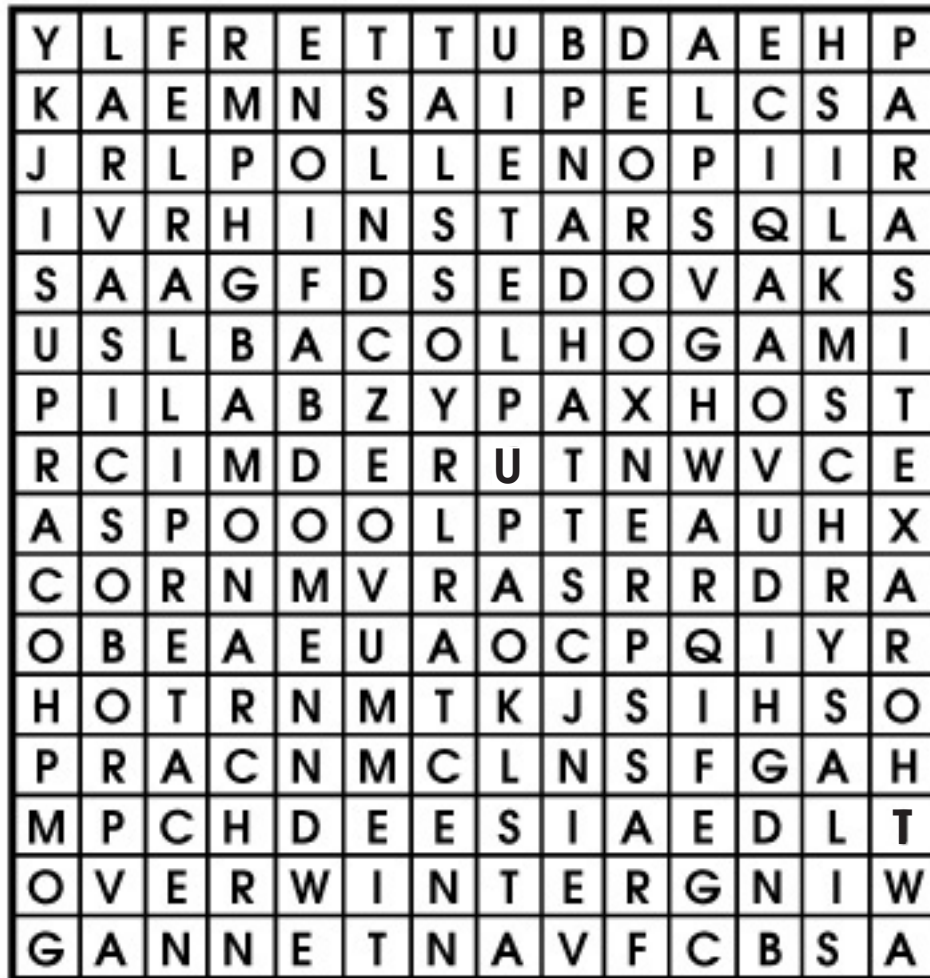


Monarch Wordfind

 If you can find 0-5 you're an egg 6- 11 you're at the larval stage
 12-17 you're in the chrysalis 18 or more, well done, you're a Monarch!

antenna sense organ on the head of an insect, used for feeling, smelling, and tasting. In Monarch larvae, these are often confused with the tentacles or filaments

butterfly any of various insects of the order Lepidoptera, characteristically having slender bodies, knobbed antennae, and four broad, usually colourful wings

caterpillar larva of a butterfly

chrysalis pupa of a butterfly

gomphocarpus a genus of milkweed

head

imago the adult stage or sexually mature insect

instar the stage of a postembryonic immature insect between moults

larva the second stage, after the egg, in metamorphosis. Also known as caterpillar

monarch

ova female reproductive cell of animals, egg

overwinter to remain alive over the winter

ovum plural of ova

parasite an organism that grows, feeds, and is sheltered on or in a different organism while contributing nothing to the survival of its host

pollen minute grains borne in the anther sac at the tip of the stamen of a flowering plant

proboscis the adult's feeding tube, for sucking nectar

pupa the third stage in metamorphosis, after the larval stage

scale piece of chitin which overlaps and covers butterflies' bodies and wings

seed

silk

thorax the middle section of an insect's body, segment to which legs and wings attach

vein any chitinous, rod-like or hollow tube-like structure supporting and stiffening the wings in insects, especially those extending longitudinally from the base of the wing to the outer margin

wing
